WHAT IS THE ULMS?

ULMS stands for Unified Library Management System. It's a next-generation digital platform for providing library services across the California State University.

WHAT WILL IT DO?

- 1. AID DISCOVERY.** The platform will serve as a gateway to digital resources for CSU students, faculty and staff across disciplines, ensuring library users at every campus equally powerful access to articles, e-journals and e-books.
- 2. UNITE RESOURCES.** The ULMS will provide “consortium capabilities,” allowing libraries to see what other campuses are buying and leverage that knowledge for better contracts when purchasing digital journals and articles.
- 3. EMPOWER ANALYTICS.** Libraries will easily be able to share and compare user data, giving the CSU a more complete picture of what books, journals and resources are in high demand and allowing libraries to better serve users' needs.
- 4. SIMPLIFY WORKFLOW.** Currently, staff must enter the same data into multiple systems, many that don't communicate with each other. One platform reduces redundant data entry and unifies the source of data about CSU library collections.

WHO SUPPORTS THE ULMS?

The ULMS is a collaboration between the CSU libraries and the Chancellor's Office.

LEARNING FROM OTHERS

Many other library systems are beginning to implement unified platforms. CSU has been consulting with the Orbis Cascade Alliance of 37 libraries based in Oregon, Washington, and Idaho. The University of California libraries are also beginning to explore a unified platform.
